Abstracts can only be submitted online via the conference profile on our website; submissions by fax, post or email will not be considered. All abstracts must be written in English. It is the author's responsibility to proofread and check the abstract. Any errors in spelling, grammar or

scientific fact in the abstract text will be reproduced as typed by the author. Abstract titles will be subject to a spell check if the abstract is selected for presentation.

#### **Abstract Submission Process**

Before submitting an abstract, a conference profile needs to be created. One or several abstracts can be submitted from the conference profile. After an abstract has been created, modifications can be made until the submission deadline.

Electronic submission of abstracts for symposia, workshops, panel debates and open papers will be possible until March 31, 2015. Submission of poster abstracts will be possible until May 31, 2015. Starting December 1, 2014, submitted abstracts will be reviewed on an ongoing basis.

Delegates who are presenting must register for the congress before the presentation can be included in the program.

After submission of the abstract, a confirmation email will be sent to the abstract submitter.
